OSU STAFF ADVISORY COUNCIL MINUTES
October 8, 2014 – 412 SU

Nathan Moorman, Chair, called the meeting to order at 1:17 pm. The roll call was completed noting that Jim Gardner had resigned his Exempt 2014-2017 position. Joseph Dunnigan, University Counseling Services, was appointed and approved as a new member for the At-Large 2013-16 position.

Approval of Minutes: The September 10, 2014, minutes were approved as presented.

Approval of Agenda: The agenda was approved as presented.

Guest Speakers:

Steve Spradling, Director of Parking & Transportation, introduced himself to the Council. He noted there are currently 15,300 total parking spaces available on campus. He also gave an update on the 60 parking spaces added to the Wentz garage this past summer for staff. This was done in preparation for the Human Sciences Project which will be starting in December. The IT Building on Hall of Fame will be moving over 100 people from inner campus lots and should take effect in October. In addition, they have recently opened 100 spaces for commuter students. They also plan to put a parking lot in place of the old Farm House after it is taken down. Mr. Spradling informed us the bike permits were made available to purchase online last fall. These permits are free of charge except for a small shipping and handling fee. Before the new Performing Arts Center is built, they wish to construct a parking structure at the corner of Hester and Ramsey. They will also be purchasing three new ADA Busses and 3 Coach Busses to go to and from Tulsa. These will be funded up to 83% through federal funding. Recently, they have been awarded a \$3,000,000 grant for new transit busses for on-campus use. Mr. Spradling also noted of a possible increase in parking permit pricing and will likely take effect next fall.

Brandon Mitts, Coordinator of Allied Arts, introduced himself to the Council. He presented a 3-part formula for enhancing innovation and creativity. These parts include passion, ability and inspiration. Brandon noted his job is to provide regularly-scheduled inspiration on a monthly basis. The next performance will be by Scottish Folk singer Julie Fowlis. She will be coming to campus on Tuesday, October 14, 2014, at 8:00pm. (Flyer Attached)

Dr. Ronald Beer, Ombudsman, introduced himself to the Council. He shared his contact information along with his office location (336 Student Union). He is currently working on developing a website to include a code of ethics adopted by the National Ombudsman Association. He presented 4 fundamental principles on which he operates. These 4 values include confidentiality, being impartial, informality and independence. Dr. Beer also encourages all faculty and staff to attend various training sessions to help in the prevention of future problems.

Meghann reported she met with Darlene Croci to discuss the SAC survey, specifically the comment portion. They found there were many concerns regarding current pay issues. She also suggested Faculty and Staff Council make a combined effort to address tuition for dependents and present it to Administration. Meghann recommended the survey be added to SAC's Bylaws and sent out each year to gage more staff opinions.

Public Relations: Ray Catalino

In Ray's absence, Shelly Potter gave an update on the creation of the new SAC Facebook page. She noted they will have the completed guidelines by next month's meeting.

Awards & Recognition: Jennifer Craig

Jennifer noted they have chosen the pictures of the catalog items to be seen on the manuals and Awards website. They met last week with the MTM vendor for software training on the Staff Service Awards website. The program should be up and running within the next couple weeks. Posters will be printed and put up around campus to use as visual advertisement. They have also begun the process of reviewing DSA applications. They have elected Toby Tucker to be Chair Person for the Staff Celebration Day.

Fund Raising (Special Committee): Jovette Dew

Jovette announced they are starting to advertise for Harvest II (Flyer Attached). They will be collecting can goods November 7th on the Student Union Plaza. She informed the council that they will be drawing for the Homecoming raffle on Monday, October 13th at 2:30pm. They will only be accepting tickets until 5:00pm Friday, October 10th in room 405 Scott Hall.


The next meeting will be the November 12 @ 1:15 pm in 412SU-Council Room.

A. Theatre Works: In the Heat of the Night


Nov. 4, 2014 at 8:00pm in the Seretean Center Concert Hall

Feb. 16, 2015 at 8:00pm in the Seretean Center Concert Hall






